
WEDNESDAY LENTEN SERVICES: During Lent, Monday services will be put on hold.

To check out, write the date, your name and the name of the book/DVD/CD in the notebook on the shelf.




## NEW BIBLE CLASS ON THE WAY



## **A LOOK AT LUTHER**

## LUTHER BEGINS THE REFORMATION

Through his study of the Bible, Martin Luther finally came to the knowledge of the truth. He found his Savior, and through faith he now had peace with God. This made him eager to share the blessings of the Gospel with others. The time had come when he was to give the pure Word of God to the whole world. God used the Pope to move Luther to begin the work of reforming the church.

It came about in this way. The Pope wanted to collect a large sum of money to build St. Peter's Church in Rome. In order to get this money, he sent monks into Germany to sell indulgences to the people. These indulgences were letters from the Pope which promised the people who bought them that they would not have to suffer so long and so much for their sins in purgatory (remember, purgatory is **not** a teaching of the Bible – it is a false teaching). Many people were eager to buy these letters, because they thought it was an easy way to get forgiveness of sins. Some even believed that if they had these papers, they could sin as much as they wished. A monk by the name of John Tetzel offered these indulgences for sale not far from Wittenberg. He promised all who bought them this: "When the pieces of money in the chest do ring; quickly the souls out of purgatory spring."

Luther was shocked when he heard how Tetzel was deceiving the people. He warned the people of Wittenberg not to buy indulgences. This made Tetzel angry, and he threatened to report Luther to the Pope. But Luther was sure that this business of selling indulgences was wrong and should be stopped. Before writing to the Pope about it, he decided to talk the matter over with other learned men at the university in a public debate. The way this was done in those days was to put down on



paper the points that were to be debated. These points were stated in sentences called theses. They were posted in some public place where everybody could read them.

The first of November, All Saints' Day, was a great festival in the Catholic Church. Already on the day before, Halloween, the people would flock to the church. On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther walked up to the Castle Church in Wittenberg and fastened a sheet of paper to the front door. On this paper he had written 95 theses, in which he showed what was wrong with the indulgences. The people coming to church read the theses and some copied them. In a short time Luther's theses spread all over Germany and to other parts of Europe.

No one had the courage to enter into a debate with Luther. But the theses caused great excitement among the people everywhere. Some saw his theses as an attack on the Pope and they became angry with him. They said that he should be punished. But many agreed that Luther had stated the truth. Luther himself did not know at the time that he had accused the Catholic Church of false doctrine and that he had, with these theses, begun a reformation of the church.

#### CALL TO ORDER

#### VISION TIMELINE

- ⇒ Council and other members of the congregation reviewed the vision timeline and came up with a list of several items that everyone felt should be the congregation's key focuses in 2021. These were the items:
  - ♦ Improve service projection, audio recording and livestreaming
  - ♦ Strengthen core and leaders…by intentionalizing Bible study participation and encouraging and supporting home devotions
  - Jesus Cares at church and group homes
  - ♦ Explore early childcare ministry opportunities
  - ♦ Seek volunteer part-time office assistant

#### FINANCIAL REPORT

- ⇒ Brad R. presented a financial report showing a net gain of \$14,277.11 through the end of 2020. MSC to accept financial report for 2020.
- ⇒ Council voted to remove the housing allowance transfer for a total of -\$10,704 income from the budget. MSC
- ⇒ Council voted to propose a budget of \$209,533 to the congregation at the next congregational meeting for approval. This budget would give year-end balance of -\$10,805.MSC

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

- ⇒ The church council nominees will be Ron Baerbock, Tyler Jessie, and Garrett Jessie.
- ⇒ We will be continuing the pastor rotation and meals on Wednesday night services throughout Lent.
- ⇒ We will be discontinuing Monday night services during Lent. More discussions will be had on continuing them in the future.
- ⇒ Hymnals will again be available for use during services, however all information will still be printed in the sevice bulletins.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- ⇒ Carmon Gilbertson will be transferred to St. Matthew's in Winona. MSC
- ⇒ There is an opportunity to be eligible for a second PPP loan. More discussion on whether or not we will apply for this loan will happen next month.

The meeting adjourned at 9 pm with Pastor leading us in the Lord's Prayer.
