Several online offering options were reviewed. Council was in favor of going forward with choosing one and the exact platform to be utilized will be explored further.


Pastor asked that as the budget is formulated, to keep in mind that 5-7 youth and 2 adults will likely attend an International Youth Rally this summer.



OLD BUSINESS

Council approved the purchase of 15 new hymnals to be used for choir use. We will open up to the members of the congregation the opportunity to piggy-back on the order.

Vision Timeline Review Update

On December 20th, a review of Faith's Vision Timeline was held at Black River Falls. The gathering of church council and congregational members started at 6 pm with a prayer, and then Pastor directed the conversation by first reviewing the items suggested for focus from last year's meeting. After discussion, those present felt that the priorities of 2021 were evaluated, explored, and begun in various stages that they did not need to be specifically mentioned in 2022 priorities.

Next, review was made of the current timeline giving time to discuss, suggest, or highlight items those present felt could/should be a priority in the coming year. Included in these were items that were suggested by individuals, groups, and committees prior to this meeting. Each of these items was written on the board until the group had made its way through the vision timeline.

Having finished highlighting certain ministries, ideas and suggestions, the group prioritized the items on the board. It was decided that the top five would receive priority for the year 2022. These are the items that were prioritized:

Utilize Synod Programs at our congregation as workshops/in worship to educate/ strengthen faith in areas of, but not limited to, member care, sharing of faith, stewardship, faith life

Organize a VBS type activity at our Cataract campus

Seek to identify someone within our membership to be the website manager for Faith's website

Add a projector (looking at both campuses, with Cataract campus a possible priority)

More formally organized new member welcome and prospect follow-up

Two final things were discussed and decided. It was decided to change the format of the vision timeline to reflect what is currently being done, what we want to get done and how to get it done, what we would like to do in 2 years, and what would be things that would be goals in 10 years. Secondly, it was decided to move exploring outreach, in connection with requesting a summer vicar, up from 10 years to 2 years. An updated Vision Timeline will be available for you to pick up at the end of January.

FROM THE LIBRARY

HELP WANTED

We are looking for some people to help run the livestream portion of our worship service. This would involve either helping run the PowerPoint during the service or running the audio video equipment during the service. If you would be interested in helping out in both areas, that would be great too.

What all would be asked of you?

PowerPoint –You would be asked to advance the slides on the computer that correspond with the bulletin as the worship service goes along. This would simply require the repeated pressing of a keyboard key or clicker. Training would be made available so that you would feel comfortable.

Audio/Video – This would require learning how to start, set-up, and run the projector, computer, camera, and audio equipment that is set up in back of church. However, before you dismiss this as being too difficult, there is a handbook that helps walk you through this step by step. You would not be "thrown to the wolves" right away, but would have opportunity to learn how it works before ever running it for a church service. During the first few times of running it for a worship service, others would be available to help you if you have any questions. One of the biggest things with this is the willingness and ability to arrive to worship 30 minutes early to make sure everything is set up and ready to go.


January 23, 2022

What is Jesus Cares Ministries, you ask? Jesus Cares Ministries is a ministry that shares God's Word with people who have disabilities. This month Faith Lutheran Church will be restarting our Jesus Cares Ministry with a "bang." First, we will have a guest preacher – Pastor Joel Gaertner – on Sunday, January 9.

Pastor Gaertner is the Vice President of Ministry and National Director of Jesus Cares Ministries. He is responsible for the overall ministry and developing and monitoring the Jesus Cares Ministries programs in congregations. He also serves as the chairman of the WELS Commission on Special Ministries. On January 9, he will lead us in a Worship at the Cross (WATC) service.

WATC is a simplified or adaptive worship service exclusively designed for individuals with special needs, following the basic pattern of Christian worship. The service shares the Gospel at the level of many of those with special needs. The format of the service is a PowerPoint presentation, which eliminates the challenges of having to hold a folder, hymnal or other service book. Five picture symbols give the participants a visual guide through the service.

Participants are invited to use a rhythm instrument (e.g., a maraca or similar instrument) to participate, this is especially helpful if they are unable to sing. Jesus Cares Ministries gives God's people of all ages the opportunity to serve their Savior and people with special needs.

Then, on Saturday, January 29, Faith Lutheran Church will host a Jesus Cares Gathering at the Aptiv Center, located at 720 Red Iron Road in Black River Falls. This gathering will include a Worship at the Cross, snacks and a craft.
