I Need More...MONEY


Someone once asked John D. Rockefeller, "How much money is enough?" "Just a little more," he answered. At the time, he was one of the wealthiest men in the world.

Those who've heard that story and Rockefeller's answer, usually divide into two groups: they either think of him as a greedy miser ("He has more money than he knows what to do with!") or an honest pragmatist ("Hey, he's just telling the truth—even if you're rich, a little more is always nice."). Don't we all occasionally find ourselves thinking, "I need more money?"

There's nothing wrong with financial security, but how much is enough? If you are pricing a vacation home in Florida and feel frustrated that you don't have enough to buy a Ferrari too, that's one thing. If you lost your job and can't pay the bills, and it's getting tough to put food on the table, that's something else.

This is a complicated issue. It's not easy to properly distinguish between real needs and selfish greed. Do you really need more money? Maybe.

Maybe not. When it comes to finances, the best advice comes from Jesus Christ. Our Savior said, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do not destroy and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew *6:19-21*).



According to Jesus, a lot of folks expend an enormous amount of time and energy in pursuit of earthly treasure and financial security, but for what? In the end—if a bad economy, a poor decision, or unforeseen disaster doesn't

claim it, time certainly will you can't take it with you.

That makes heaven the only worthwhile investment. And here's the great news: Jesus lived, died, and rose again to provide all the heavenly treasure for you. Peace with Godnow and forever—that's what he freely gives.

Put your trust in Jesus. Find in him real treasure and eternal security. What more do you need? Besides, Christians know that the Lord will always provide. We've got his Word on that: "Do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:31-33).

Do you really need more monev? You don't need to answer that question. Put your trust in Christ—seek first his kingdom and his righteousness—and let him answer the question for you.

CALL TO ORDER

ELDER'S REPORT

- ◆ A motion was made to receive into membership by means of transfer Ron and Karen Baerbock. Moved, Seconded, Consensus (MSC). To be ratified at the next quarterly meeting.
- A motion was made to grant the peaceful transfer of Gordon Ritter to Bethany Lutheran Church in Kenosha Wisconsin. MSC. To be ratified at the next quarterly meeting.
- Council was informed that Corey Bue will be received into membership by means of confession of faith in November
- Pastor conducted a private baptism for Jemma Rain Hendrickson on Saturday, October 5.

PASTOR'S REPORT

- Pastor presented a statistical report for the month of September and a summary of upcoming worship, bible class opportunities, outreach prospects and contact that has been made with them, as well as the youth group's planned events and service projects
- Council approved up to \$150 in covering the cost of a meal for a planned youth outing in December
- Pastor presented details about the WELS Lutheran Leadership Conference that will be held in Chicago in January. He encouraged the council to contemplate whether they saw value in members or pastor attending such a conference. He provided them with material to consider in making their decision.
- ♦ 10 subscriptions of Meditations for the amount of \$185 will be purchased to hand out to perspective new members MSC
- Pastor presented the statistical report that will be presented at the Voters' meeting drawing the council's attention to the decrease in Bible Class attendance and asked if there was any discussion on that point

FINANCIAL REPORT

- Brad presented a financial report showing a net loss of only \$917.35 through the end of September. MSC to accept financial report for September, 2019
- There was an accounting error that occurred during the transition of treasurers. This error caused the pastor's salary to be overpaid nearly \$4,500 over the synod guidelines this year. This error will be discussed at the quarterly voter's meeting. The council has suggested that this sum should not be paid back to the church. MSC

- The vision timeline will be reviewed by the outreach committee and the church council on November 12th at 6:30 in BRF. Everyone is to go through the survey sheet from the Ministry Conference before this meeting

NEW BUSINESS

• Pastor presented the church council with information concerning Martin Luther College's 2-year campaign titled "Equipping Christian Witnesses." He asked approval to show a couple videos and include inserts that would highlight this campaign, and suggested a door offering be taken to support this campaign. There will be a door offering in the future to support "Equipping Christian Witnesses"

New Business: After discussing Pastor's health insurance, the motion was made that "the congregation will fund the WELS-VEBA plan 3 and will be responsible for the difference of the "individual Maximum out of Packet" and the "family maximum out of pocket" amounts of plan 2 to the "Individual Maximum out of pocket" and the "Family maximum out of pocket" amounts of plan 3, plus an additional 5% of plan 2's "Maximum out of pocket", both individual and family. This payment if needed, would be funded from the congregation's WELS-CEF savings account. This will restrict the use of this account for this purpose only. There will be an additional amount set aside each year if the congregation does need to pay towards that maximum out of pocket. This amount will be decided while setting the budget at the next council meeting.



OUR MISSION

To use Life & Family Issues As Bridges To Convey The Love of God & To Share The Message Of Salvation Through Christ.

This organization educates people on what God's Word has to say about the value and sanctity of human life. The intent is to mobilize Christians to make God-pleasing decisions about life and family issues. We focus attention on many issues such as: abortion, infertility, birth control, post-abortion syndrome, assisted suicide, and euthanasia.

OUR BEGINNING

When the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion nationally on January 22, 1973, members of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Libertyville, Illinois, saw the need to do something. Working with their pastor and with members from area Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS) congregations, they opened the first WELS Lutherans for Life pregnancy counseling center. As time passed, more and more independent centers sprouted up around the country until 1983 when they united to form the national organization that existed as WELS Lutherans for Life. In 1999, the name was changed to Christian Life Resources, Incorporated.

OUR AFFILIATION WITH THE WELS

Christian Life Resources subjects itself to the doctrine and practice of the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod, but it is not supervised or funded by the WELS budget or its administrators.

OUR GROWTH

Today, our organization consists of pregnancy care centers across the United States. These centers are visited by approximately 11,000 clients each year. Our network of pregnancy care affiliates offer a warm heart, listening ear and helping hand along with a wealth of information to guide those involved in an unexpected life choice.

Christian Life Resources founded and supports New Beginnings – A Home for Mothers, located in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. This program began in 1993 in response to the needs of single mothers and their newborns by providing residence and assistance in spiritual, academic, and vocational concerns.

Since 1993, New Beginnings has provided a place for a single mother and her child to live, learn to care for her child, and, most importantly, learn about God and the salvation he provides in Jesus. Because we are having CLR come again for a mission festival, we also wanted to participate again in the Change for Life program to help support mothers and babies at New Beginnings. In February we collected and sent in \$700.
