PowerPoint –You would be asked to advance the slides on the computer that correspond with the bulletin as the worship service goes along. This would simply require the repeated pressing of a keyboard key or clicker. Training would be made available so that you would feel comfortable.

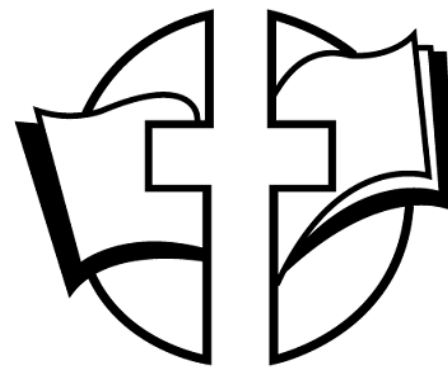

However, before you dismiss this as being too difficult, there is a handbook that helps walk you through this step by step. You would not be “thrown to the wolves” right away, but would have opportunity to learn how it works before ever running it for a church service. During the first few times of running it for a worship service, others would be available to help you if you have any questions. **One of the biggest things with this is the willingness and ability to arrive to worship 30 minutes early to make sure everything is set up and ready to go.**

Dress yourself with...Gentleness

What do washing machines, dish soap, a grizzly bear named “Ben,” and *you* have in common? You, the bear, and those other items can all be *gentle*.

St. Paul encouraged the members of one of his churches, “Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near” (Philippians 4:5).

Too often we associate gentleness with being a wimp. That is not true. Washing machines can rip clothes to shreds. Soaps can irritate the skin. Bears can maul people. And just turn on the news to see what destruction human beings can do.

Nevertheless, we can be gentle. We can learn to be unselfish and considerate in all we do.

Think what the world would be like if everyone showed unselfish consideration for others! There would be no road rage. Children wouldn’t fight over a particular toy. Divorce might even come to a halt.

Unfortunately, we will never be able to be perfectly gentle in this life. That isn’t an excuse, it is a reality. And it is a reality that gives evidence to our sinfulness. But there is good



news, Jesus was perfectly gentle. With a word, Jesus could calm a raging sea or cause a tree to wither. Yet he never failed to heal the sick, preach good news to the poor, and offer forgiveness to the worst of sinners.

Jesus even offers forgiveness to us for the times we have failed to be gentle, those times when we insisted on getting our way and didn’t care whom we hurt to get it. He offers that forgiveness on the basis of his payment for our sins. You see, Jesus doesn’t just say “you are forgiven.” He had to secure forgiveness by paying the penalty for sin. That’s because God’s holiness required that sin be punished. But God

so desires us to be able to be in heaven with him, that he sent his Son to take that punishment so we wouldn’t have to.

So in gentleness, Jesus came. He could have squashed Judas and that crowd who came to arrest him in Gethsemane. But in gentleness he went with them to be a lamb led to slaughter. He could have smashed those who pulled his beard and beat his back. But in gentleness he allowed it so that he could be rejected in our place. He could have exercised his power and broke the wrists of those who nailed him to the cross. But in love he knew his death was the only way to pay the penalty for sin, so that all who believe in him could be saved.

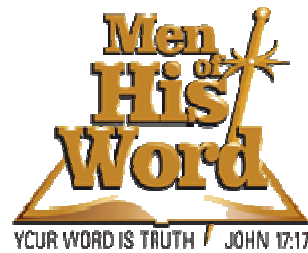
When we think of Jesus’ willingness to forgive us, it makes us want to be more like him – gentle and caring. So let us continue to listen often to his gentleness that is proclaimed in worship and Bible Class. As we do, we will bask in the beauty of our forgiveness and be strengthened to see that we have been saved not to go sin, but to go live as our Savior lived.

WE CAN DO THE INCREDIBLE

Bob Parr lives in the suburbs, punches the clock as an insurance salesman, and battles a bulging waistline. Clark Kent gets stressed out from the pressures of life as a newspaper reporter and his crush on Lois Lane. Science-savvy Peter Parker does his homework and looks after his Aunt May. Each of these all-too-ordinary individuals has been summoned to, more or less, save the world. Talk about pressure.

Sometimes we might think there is a lot of pressure on us when congregational leadership comes to us and lays a need before us. Is that how we felt when we received information in June about our Jubilee Debt Reduction Offering? Is that how we felt when we heard that the leaders were hoping to receive \$100,000 to put toward our mortgage payment? I pray pressure is not what you felt. Instead, I pray you saw an opportunity - an opportunity to see God at work in the fulfillment of his promises: *“If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things?” (Romans 8:31,32)*

God is for us! Notice that this is a statement of fact. The FACT is God has already shown himself to be on our side. He gave his Son on our behalf. The argument that is made in those words is one from the greater to the lesser. Since God did the greater thing of giving his Son into death to win our salvation for us, won't he now also do the “lesser” and “easier” things in the life such as giving us all the spiritual and temporal necessities of life? The answer is yes, and Jesus is the guarantee of that.

He did not spare his one and only Son, but gave him up into death, even the death of a cross, for us. That takes our breath away. God is for us. He is on our side. With that truth standing behind us, we can do the incredible.

To date, God's people here at Faith have given \$41,912 to this special offering. This month wraps up our Jubilee Debt Reduction Offering. We will have special services on October 17th and 24th. You will receive an emailed devotion in the middle of the month. You will hear one final ministry moment from your congregational leaders. How close will we get to our goal? Will we surpass it? We will have to wait and see. But rejoice in the fact that what we don't have to wait and see is whether or not God loves us. Celebrate that we don't have to wait and see whether we are forgiven. Delight in the truth that we don't have to wait and see whether God will provide each of us with what we need in this life. That's incredible, and that gives us the power to do the incredible.

Prayer: Dear Jesus, we praise you as our Savior and Lord. When we are distracted by the comforts and concerns of this world, attract our devotion with the wonder of your promises. Then, give us courage to act with determined urgency, contribute with joyful generosity, and pray with unceasing fervor. We can do this because you loved us first. That is incredible! Amen.



Oh, and one more thing. Unlike our cell phone, we don’t have to worry about our Bible being disconnected. Jesus has already paid the bill.

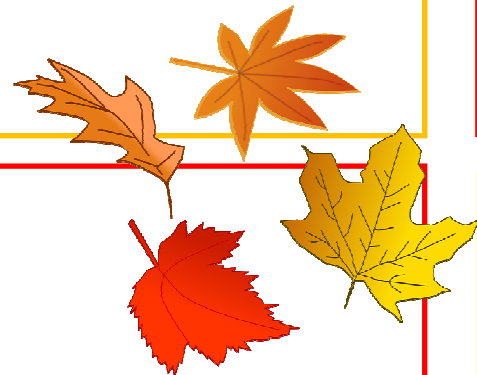

CENTRAL AFRICA MEDICAL MISSION

September 2021



The Lutheran Mobile Clinic has been blessed for the past year by having Vicar- now Pastor Kalima serving the congregations at our Msambo, Suzi and Thunga clinic sites. Pastor Kalima who is a recent graduate from our seminary in Lusaka, can be seen at our clinics ministering to the patients where he has taken particular interest in helping the mothers of children with disabilities. Some of those he has helped, have since started attending his church.

Pastor Kalima recently wrote an article about the Lutheran Mobile Clinic that was published in a magazine called the Malawi Lutheran Christian. The magazine is read by many members of the Lutheran Church of Central Africa (LCCA) - Malawi. Many of those members live outside of the Lilongwe area and may not be aware of the medical mission. I thought I would share the article with you. It was originally written in Chichewa -the local language and translated into English, some grammar and spelling has been fixed. But as much as possible this is Pastor Kalima in his own words.

The Lutheran Mobile Clinic

This is an organization or a group that is standing on its own, it does its work in a hospital setting in cooperation or coordination with the government. This organization is under the One Africa Team (OAT). This mobile clinic has developed a huge bond with LCCA especially in the areas that the mobile clinic is working by helping the sick by giving them the medicines, giving some disabled children wheelchairs and others just helping them with mobility to get to where they get their physiotherapy and also spreading the gospel. This organization is run by Mr Gary Evans and Sister in Charge Beth Evans. When the two leave Malawi for USA of which they will be leaving their roles to two of our LCCA members who will then be running the organization of course with help from Gary as then he will be the Field Director for Malawi and Zambia. The two LCCA members who will take over from Gary and sister Beth are Lusungu Mwambeye as the Clinic Administrator and Violet Chikwatu as Nurse in Charge. As of now about 5 more LCCA members from the surrounding the areas have benefited from this organization through being employed as volunteers to work with the team. This organization also helps to transport patients from the respective clinics in the villages to Kamuzu Central hospital in the event that the patient need extra care.

How is the synod benefiting from the mobile clinic?

This is the question which most Lutherans in Malawi would ask. But the answer is the Lutheran Mobile clinic is a tool of Matthew 28:19 "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit,". There are times where we as the Lutheran synod fail to reach out to other members or non-members through the gospel. But when they came to the clinic, they are able to be preached to and get the spiritual help from the clinic as every morning the clinic holds devotions before starting its services this has helped our parishes such as Mtimaoyera (Msambo), Suzi and Thunga parish to bring in more servants to God.

Where is the secret for all this?

The answer is God is the answer to all this blessing for He is the reason why we get to have knowledge and power to work and help those in need. I just wanted you to know a little of it but you will read more in the magazine coming soon.
