

DEVOTIONS ON THE LORD'S PRAYER

Only the very inexperienced are surprised when something breaks, fails to function, or goes wrong. The older you get the more you realize that sooner or later everything in the world wears out, clogs up, rusts, becomes diseased, withers, rots, dies or becomes useless. This is the disastrous result of sin. Sin covers creation like dew. Nothing escapes. Everything is affected. Everything is doomed.

When you think about the world covered with the curse of sin, you almost want to yell out, "Get me out of here!" God will, in due time, get us out of this vale of tears. But in the mean time we should cherish our life as priceless. Our life is God's gift. Eternal life is his greater gift. True, we are still in an evil world, but through Jesus we will overcome.

While we trudge through this sin-cursed world we pray, "Deliver us from evil." Now, when we pray this petition we should not expect to be engulfed in a pink cloud and be spared all the agonies, disappointments and heartaches of life. Evil is part of life. But when we pray this petition, there are four things that we are praying for.

First, we ask God that if it be his will, he keep evil from us altogether. Certainly God can and does do this. How many times don't we see this very thing throughout the Bible? The lions didn't harm Daniel; the fire didn't consume Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego; and Peter was miraculously released from prison. If only we knew how many times God has kept us from evil by preventing an accident (perhaps by a child making us late), averted a fire (perhaps by some appliance breaking down), or any such thing, we would pray this petition with even greater earnestness.

Yet because we are sinners living in a world ripe with evil, we know we won't always escape that evil. So secondly, we pray in this petition that God give us the strength to bear the evil that comes our way. Satan seeks to use the evil that comes upon us to turn us from our faith, and no greater evil could befall us than to lose saving faith. So we ask God to help us bear it patiently, trusting that he is faithful and *"will not let you be tempted beyond what you can bear. But when you are tempted, he will also provide a way out so that you can stand up under it" (1 Corinthians 10:13).*

Thirdly, when we pray "deliver us from evil," we pray that God in his good pleasure would turn the evil we must endure into good, much like he turned the hatred of Joseph's brothers into the good of raising Joseph to the position of leadership in Egypt. God comforts us with the truth that he will use evil for our good when he has Paul proclaim, **"We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him" (Romans 8:28).** We might not always see how he uses it for our good, and the way he uses it may only be for our spiritual and eternal good. But how God decides to use it isn't for us to know; it is simply for us to trust his promise that he will use it for our good.

Finally, when we speak the words of this petition, we are also asking that no evil take away our faith and that God deliver us from all evil completely by taking us to heaven. In this petition we are saying, "Rescue me from all the evil consequences of my sins. Save me from the clutches of the devil. Rip me out of the jaws of hell. Do not let its flames engulf me in the hour of death and on the day of your just judgment. Even in this life do not deal with me as my sins and my sinful nature deserve. Deliver me from the shame that I would have if everyone around me knew all that I have done to deserve disgrace. Deliver me from the terrors of mind and the afflictions of the body that would be mine if I had to suffer even here for each of my offenses in my mind and sins committed with my mouth, my eyes, my ears, my hands and feet. Father, dear Father, deliver us from evil."
